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MARATHON READING OF KAZANTZAKIS POETRY IN GREEK

The marathon reading of Kazantzakis' *Odyssey* continues successfully - we are in the rhapsody. O - , judging by the participation, mainly of young people, but also of friends living in various cities and countries. At the end of April, 17,866 verses had been read out of 33,333.

TESTIMONIES

Interview with **Jean-Herbert,** an Asianist, father of our friend Yvette, which we published in the last issue of "SYNTHESIS" (Source: Review "Rencontre Orient-Occident", Geneva, October-December, 1967, et ORTF, "Kazantzakis Week", February 1968).

For me, the centre of Kazantzak's work remains a small booklet that has not yet received the dissemination it deserves, but as it seems to me it is the key to all his characters, both in his novels and in his theatre. For Kazantzakis does not merely see his characters; they are an integral part of him, he lives them, all together and each one separately. Their drama is also his own inner drama. In this little book, entitled Asceticism, Kazantzakis strips himself bare, revealing all the undercurrents raging within him, as well as the purpose of his search and the ruthless discipline he imposes on himself. Discipline, that's the key word. It is for him "the highest virtue", even for his own body, for which he writes: "I train my body like a war-steed; I impose restraint and strength on it." Strength, another key word. The phrase that had impressed him most in Vivekananda, whose texts he translated for me into Greek, was, as he often told me: "The only sin is weakness." Kazantzakis did not tolerate in himself, nor did he accept in others, anything weak or petty. The greatest compliment he could say about someone he admired was: "He is a giant". Power manifested itself in his vision. "He looked into the abyss, without illusions, without arrogance, without fear," he writes twice in

"Asceticism". It is also manifested in his choice of his course of the "Do not deign to ask whether you will win or be defeated. Fight! Drive away the greatest temptation: hope." And in this cry engraved on his tomb: "I hope for nothing, I fear nothing, I am free". His path is simple: "the rush to the peaks". Not by "the easiest road", but by "the most rugged", where "the ascent is dangerous and secret".

For him, the struggle, the uphill, must be unceasing.

"The greatest sin," he writes again in the Ascetic, "is contentment." "Unfaithful are the satisfied, the satiated,

the sterile". In this "struggle for freedom", which, as he writes, "is the essence of my God", in this hard struggle, which "does not accept limits", which "every moment bids farewell to everything", Kazantzakis does not retreat when confronted with cruelty. Of those Homeric oracles that possessed him in the face of injustice, falsehood or cowardice, he writes: "In your anger, an ancestor thunders with your mouth".

A tireless worker, passionate and persistent, Kazantzakis draws unabashedly from all the greats: Dante, Goethe, Shakespeare and Homer, whom he translates; the Buddha, whom he seeks as far as China and Japan; Lenin and the Indian sages, whom he studies in depth and assimilates.

One day when my daughter [this is Yvette] and I were leaving with him from UNESCO, where, out of discipline, he had been confined to a desk for a year, the conversation came to Hamlet. I asked him: "Did you translate Hamlet?" His face flushed, and, rising to his feet, he answered me with indignation: "Of course!"

The concern for meticulous perfection permeated his entire life. I believe he rewrote his Odyssey six or seven times to be satisfied. But even when he was building his house on the cliff of Aegina, where I first saw him in the 1930s, he would go to the quarry himself to choose the stone to be placed on each step of his staircase.

But, in all this fiery quest, fuelled by love for his race, for all of humanity, for his dead ancestors and the generations to come, and for the entire Earth, Kazantzakis remains haunted by the idea of God. That God whom neither the seas nor the mountains can hold, but who fits whole in the heart of man, that God who needs man to win.

"My prayer," he writes, "is not a beggar's dirge, nor is it a confession of love. It's not a commercial account: I gave you so much, give me so much. My prayer is a soldier's report to his general: here is what I did today; here is what I will do tomorrow."

Does one understand why today so many young people find in him the guide they so much need, to this truly accomplished man, who, with all his strength, rigour, consistency, majesty and pride, humbly writes the words, "Teach your children the necessity of surpassing you."

Géorgui Gospodinov, Bulgarian writer AND poet (Source: Kyriaki Beyoğlu, "The Journal of the Editors", May 21, 2023). When I was serving my military service, I was sent to the Greek-Bulgarian border. Next to my weapon I had a Greek book, Kazantzakis' "Zorba", and it constantly gave me the feeling that I could understand everything.

The countries I was most interested in were those whose books I loved. Kazantzakis, Seferis, Cavafy - this is my Greece. We should read more of their books.
